ATIC409	Christian response to modernism and secularism

ATIC411	World religions in global perspective
The module aims to provide a survey of the major world religions as practiced around the world along with an introductory discussion of the role of dialogue and the issue of the salvific status of these faiths

ATIC412	From Jerusalem to Jakarta: The growth of world Christianity
This module introduces students to the main events of Christianity's history from the founding of the church to the present time with a focus on issues of missiological interest, but excluding the events of the modern missionary movement

ATIC507	Missional texts: Luke and Acts	
The module aims to enable students to analyse important aspects of Luke's contribution to the New Testament and consider how it relates to the thinking and practice of the church's involvement in the mission of God.

ATIC508	Just Issues: Prophetic mission in an unjust world	
This module will consider how contemporary Christians should engage with key contemporary issues of wealth/poverty and the environment at local and global levels, with a view to adopting appropriate and sustainable models (encompassing cultural and socio-political, as well as economic and environmental dimensions) of thinking and praxis. It will encompass a study of the OT prophets' approach to issues of ethics and justice and seek to correlate these, and other, biblical principles to contemporary issues of inequality and injustice, with missiological conclusions		
Level of Study: 5		CAT points: 10
Assessment	. 100% Coursework: Standard: 2500 words or equivalent	

ATIC512	Values, identity and faith in Christian-Muslim encounter	
A study of Christian-Muslim relations noting the various social, political and theological factors which have affected these relations, with a view of exploring the most appropriate Christian responses to Muslims and Islam in a variety of different contexts today.		
Level of Study: 5		CAT points: 10
Assessment	25% Coursework: A critical review of a significant book on Christian-Muslim relations OR 25% Coursework: 500-word report based on interviews with at least two Muslims reflecting their perceptions of Islam 75% Coursework: 2000 word essay	

ATIC510	Christ and the transformation of the human predicament
The module aims to study of the character and origin of human alienation from God and its consequences for humankind will be followed by an examination and analysis of the person and work of Christ. Students will be encouraged to reflect upon and consider both the biblical text and a range of readings from western and non-western sources.

ATIC511	Holy Spirit and the Church
The module aims to study the person and work of the Holy Spirit and various aspects of the understanding of the Church. The module aims to look at relevant biblical passages and at how the Holy Spirit and the Church have been subsequently understood by differing Christian traditions and especially in recent times.

ATIC509	Christian ethics in an intercultural world
The module aims to introduce students to various theoretical approaches to ethics, both secular and Christian and their application to a number of ethical dilemmas found across cultures.

ATIC517	Everybody to everywhere: Historical and contemporary mission movements
A study of missionary movements, historical and contemporary, in the history of Christian intercultural encounter. The module assumes a globalised and intercultural context for contemporary mission movements in which mission is (re)conceived as being 'from everywhere to everywhere'.

Assessment	100% Coursework: Standard: 2500 words or equivalent

ATIC518	Christian encounter with Hinduism
An introductory study of Hinduism. While examining its historical contexts, more importantly, the module explores how Hinduism shapes the worldview of millions in Asia today. In addition, students will be equipped to engage appropriately with both belief and practice in Western and Asian contexts.	
Level of Study: 5	CAT points: 5

ATIC519	Christian encounter the spirit world and primal religion
The module aims to explore the religious worldviews of primal religions and Biblical perspectives on the spirit world.

ATIC520	God and creation
After a discussion of the difficulty of using human language to describe the infinite God, the attributes of Godself will be examined and the notion of trinity will be analysed. The act of creation will be explored along with some of the challenges of modern science. Finally Christian teaching on the future of the universe culminating in 'the new heavens and the new earth' will be explored.

ATIC524	Christian encounter with new religious movements
This module equips students to reflect critically on both Secularism and New Religious Movements, and to explore the relationship between them. Students will be exposed to a number of biblically informed missional strategies of both critique and engagement.

ATIC524	God and revelation
The module aims to acquaint students with debates around the topics of General and Special Revelation within the Christian tradition

Level 6 modules

ATIC609	The Christian encounter with postmodernism and globalisation
The first unit will explore and evaluate from a Christian perspective the main ideas of key postmodern theorists. The globalisation unit seeks to give an overview of the process of globalisation. It will include the effects of globalisation in such areas as culture, politics, economics and the environment. Throughout the question will be asked: 'How are these new developments to be understood and responded to, in the light of the mission of the church?'	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	100% Coursework: One essay on each of the two units, 2,000 words each

ATIC609	Global philosophies and theologies of religion
The module aims to acquaint students with the main arguments in the philosophy of religion scanned cross-culturally as well as the prime strategies for the interpretation of world religions from a Christian perspective	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	50% Coursework: Standard: 2000 words or equivalent on first unit 50% Coursework: Standard: 2000 words or equivalent on second unit

ATIC610	The Kingdom of God and mission on the edge
An in-depth study of the Kingdom of God. While drawing on the full range of biblical material, the module emphasises the teaching and acts of Jesus in their socio-cultural context. In addition, the module will aid in shaping students' own lives and missional contexts within the over-arching plot of the Kingdom of God.	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	100% Coursework: Standard: 4000 words or equivalent

ATIC608	Just mission: Justice and transformation in a complex world
Engaging with the global issues and missiological implications of justice and ethics (socio-political, cultural and economic) in contemporary mission including: biblical, philosophical and ethical foundations of justice; Christian spiritualities of justice; justice in other religions; advocacy and human rights, contextual case study presentations (e.g. modern forms of slavery such as human trafficking) and the Global Justice Movement and Christian justice-focused organisations and agencies	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	25% Coursework: Individual Presentation: 20 minutes 75% Coursework: Standard: 3000 words

ATIC612	Between the global and local: missional theologies in context
A study of contextual theologies from Latin America, Africa and Asia.	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	50% Coursework: Individual presentation: 50 minutes 50% Coursework: Standard: 2000 words or equivalent

ATIC615	Dissertation
Students work semi-independently in a subject area of their choice leading to a uniquely personal piece of work. The module aims to develop students' capacity for independent thought, critical examination, analysis and synthesis. To extend students' ability to sustain systematic exposition and argument relative to their subject.	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 30
Assessment	100% coursework: Standard: 8,000 words

ATIC613	Independent study module
The module is designed for the student who is able to undertake an advanced level of independent study on a given topic not normally offered in the curriculum.	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	100% coursework: Standard: 4,000 words or equivalent.

Developing your character

ATIC401, 501, 601	Personal development programme
The personal development programme provides a structure for intentional commitment to growth in the areas of spiritual life, character, relational health, and practical service. This development will take place primarily within the context of cross-cultural community living, and will be supported and nurtured by both structured and informal meetings with a personal tutor, and by the student's own engagement with the process of self-reflection and application.	
Level of Study: 4, 5, 6	CAT points: 5
Assessment	100% Coursework: written reflection 2000-2500 words long, describing your personal growth through the year.

ATIC104	Spiritual formation for life and ministry
The term "spiritual formation" describes the life-long process of being shaped by the Holy Spirit into the likeness of Christ for the sake of others and for the glory of God. Drawing upon the Scriptures, and from the riches of Christian traditions and experience, this module will explore the dynamic nature of the Spiritual Formation process, and introduce students to a wide range of practices to help nurture spiritual depth and personal growth.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 10
Assessment	100% Coursework: Standard: 2000 words or equivalent (reflections on spiritual exercises)

ATIC504	The journey of personal transformation
The journey of personal transformation invites us to a pilgrimage of ever-deepening responsiveness to God's initiative in our lives. This module will focus on deepening our understanding of the classic Christian practices of prayer and engagement with the scriptures, and on the practices involved in incarnating our spiritual lives in community and in ministry.	
Level of Study: 5	CAT points: 10
Assessment	100% Coursework: Standard: 2000 words or equivalent (reflections on spiritual exercises)

ATIC604	The art of Christian soul care and companionship
The ministry of Christian Soul Care and Companionship, although an ancient one, rooted and modelled in Scripture and in the tradition of the church, is being rediscovered today. This module will explore the distinctive nature of Christian Soul Care, the practices and skills needed to be an effective Spiritual companion, and engage us in experiences of personal spiritual direction and retreat.	
Level of Study: 6	CAT points: 15
Assessment	100% Coursework: Standard: 4000 words or equivalent

Developing your skills

ATIC405	Transforming Teams
This module sets out to give individuals an insight into the issues that team leaders and members face, with particular reference to the issues of multicultural teams. It aims to be practical, equipping people with the self-awareness, cultural awareness and team formation and leadership skills, to enable them to lead and be effective members of small to medium size teams.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 10
Assessment	A combination of observed and assessed team exercises 60% and reflective journal writing 40%.

ATIC413	Into all the world: integral evangelism and discipleship
This module seeks to present evangelism and discipleship as the radical identification of a person, as a representative of Christ, within their spheres of influence. It includes the theory and practice of evangelism and discipleship in a variety of cultures.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 10
Assessment	100% Coursework: (Standard). A 2000 word critique of the principles and practice of evangelism and discipleship as presented by one of the visiting evangelists during the module.

ATIC414	Contemporary communication skills
This module gives students a basic introduction to contemporary trends, theory and practice in public communication skills. Students will look at a variety of methods of communication; from delivering speeches to engaging with new media. The course will include both lecture content and a practical workshop.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 10
Assessment	20% Coursework: A 250-word outline and rationale to a talk or presentation 20% Coursework: A 300-word introduction or conclusion to a talk or presentation 60% Coursework: The delivery of a 10-minute talk or presentation

ATIC403	Weekly placement
This runs concurrently with the academic programme and consists of a weekly ministry opportunity for which they have an external supervisor. Students are introduced to a variety of opportunities for Christian ministry locally. They are given a choice of placements from which they choose one that will help them discover, develop and put into practice their gifts and skills.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 5
Assessment	100% coursework: Standard (1000 words) In addition the student receives a pass / fail grade on the basis of the placement supervisor's report.

ATIC503	Weekly placement
This runs concurrently with the academic programme and consists of a weekly ministry opportunity for The student is given a further opportunity for Christian ministry locally. They are to choose a placement which differs in type from the one they did in level 1, to help them discover, develop and put into practice other gifts and skills.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 5
Assessment	100% coursework: Standard (1500 words) In addition the student receives a pass / fail grade on the basis of the placement supervisor's report.

ATIC402	Term Placement
Six weeks during Semester 3 (April/May) are dedicated to practical field experience, for which the student has an external supervisor. The student is placed with a church, para-church organisation, or community organisation, normally in the UK but, if especially requested, overseas. There are a variety of placements, reflecting the individual choice of each student.	
Level of Study: 4	CAT points: 20
Assessment	100% coursework: Standard (4000 words) In addition the student receives a pass / fail grade on the basis of the placement supervisor's report.

ATIC505	Thrive! Equipping for Cross-cultural life and ministry	
This missiology module consists of an examination of the personal preparation needed for cross-cultural encounter and a more general study of issues related to cross-cultural practice		
Level of Study: 5		CAT points: 10
Assessment	30% Coursework: Questions for a prospective overseas worker (500 words) 35% Coursework: Imaginative work (750 words) 35% Coursework: Case study (750 words) OR 100% Coursework: Standard (2000 words)	

ATIC514	Communicating Christ to a complex world 1	
The module aims to introduce the dimensions and dynamics of cross-cultural communication, develop skills for effective and meaningful communication of Christ and his message in intercultural contexts and introduce students to the theory and practice of Christian rhetorical speech and performance in diverse intercultural contexts.		
Level of Study: 5		CAT points: 10
Assessment	100% Coursework: Standard: 2500 words or equivalent
